## **The Lincolnshire Show Equine Information and Regulations**

### **Horse of the Year Show Qualifiers**

Please ensure that the Exhibitor, Owner, Rider and Horse all have HOYS User IDs  
If you do not have a User ID please contact HOYS directly on 02476 858 205 or email them on [entries@grandstand.co.uk](mailto:entries@grandstand.co.uk)

Please note for all HOYS classes the entry fee includes a £20.00 Horse of the Year Show contribution.

### **Equine Passports**

Exhibitors are required under DEFRA regulations to carry the Official Identity Document (passport) for every horse or pony when competing or travelling to the Show.

Competitors are reminded that the passport must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership and must be correctly registered with the relevant breed society, studbook, or ID issuing authority, depending on the type of horse or pony.

Spot checks will be carried out at the Lincolnshire Show, as well as at qualifying shows and by breed societies, to ensure compliance. Exhibitors must always have passports available for inspection.

Please also ensure that you are correctly registered with the appropriate Horse Society before making your entry. If you are unsure, please contact the society directly.

### **Stabling**

All stables must be booked and paid for in advance via Showing Scene. Numbers are limited; early booking is recommended.

- Stables are allocated on arrival by the Stable Manager and cannot be used until officially assigned.
- Stables may not be sub-let, shared, or transferred; they are for the competitor who reserved them only.

### **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ALLOWED**

The Lincolnshire Agricultural Society has endeavored to ensure the correctness of the particulars printed but will not accept responsibility for any error or mistakes which may arise.

- Exhibitors must provide their own bedding, feed, water buckets, and mucking out equipment. Any damage will be charged to the hirer.
- Stallions must be declared at booking; dedicated stallion boxes will be allocated if available.
- Horses may not be stabled in horseboxes or trailers.
- All stables must be cleared and tidied before departure.
- Exhibitors must present passports and vaccination records to the Stable Manager before stabling. Spot checks may be carried out.
- H&M Haylage bales and shavings will be available for purchase on site.

Stabling is managed to ensure the safety, hygiene, and welfare of all horses at the Show.

### **Farrier**

During the Show, the Farrier on call will be Scott Sykes, Available on 07595 323307

### **Veterinary Team**

All equine health and welfare matters during the Lincolnshire Show are overseen by the Show Veterinary Team from Hill & Phelan Veterinary Surgeons, who are on site and available 24 hours a day throughout the duration of the Show.

In the event of illness, injury or any welfare concern, exhibitors must contact the Veterinary Team immediately. The emergency veterinary contact number is clearly displayed in the Equine Secretaries Office with the Stable Manager.

No veterinary treatment should be administered that contravenes current competition rules. Any serious incident, infectious disease concern or horse requiring isolation must be reported without delay.

The Society reserves the right to require veterinary examination of any horse on the Showground and to take appropriate action in the interests of animal welfare and biosecurity.

### **Animal Health Vaccination Requirements**

All equines attending the Lincolnshire Show must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with current British Equestrian and national governing body guidelines.

## **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ALLOWED**

The Lincolnshire Agricultural Society has endeavored to ensure the correctness of the particulars printed but will not accept responsibility for any error or mistakes which may arise.

The vaccination course must be completed as follows:

- The first and second vaccinations must be administered 21–60 days apart.
- A third (first booster) vaccination must be given within 6 months + 21 days of the second vaccination.
- Thereafter, booster vaccinations must be administered at intervals of no more than 12 months.
- Additionally, a booster must have been given within 6 months + 21 days prior to the first day of the Show.
- No equine may enter the showground or compete if it has received an Equine Influenza vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival.

Foals should commence their vaccination programme at 6 months of age.

All vaccinations must be recorded in the equine passport and be available for inspection at any time.

Tetanus vaccination is strongly recommended in line with current veterinary advice.

The Society reserves the right to amend these requirements in accordance with updated guidance from British Equestrian or other relevant governing bodies.

### **Strangles Biosecurity Requirements**

Strangles is a highly contagious bacterial disease of horses. The Lincolnshire Show takes biosecurity seriously and all exhibitors are expected to take appropriate precautions to protect the health and welfare of all equines attending.

#### **Before Arrival**

- Horses must not travel to the Show if they are unwell or showing clinical signs consistent with strangles, including raised temperature, nasal discharge, swollen lymph nodes or abscesses.
- Any horse that has been in contact with a confirmed or suspected case of strangles within the previous 21–28 days must not attend unless cleared by a veterinary surgeon.
- Exhibitors are strongly advised to monitor their horse's temperature for several days prior to travel.

#### **During the Show**

- Direct nose-to-nose contact between horses should be avoided.
- Water buckets, feed bowls, tack and equipment must not be shared between horses.

### **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ALLOWED**

The Lincolnshire Agricultural Society has endeavored to ensure the correctness of the particulars printed but will not accept responsibility for any error or mistakes which may arise.

- Good hygiene practices must be observed at all times, including regular hand sanitising and the use of clean equipment.
- Any horse becoming unwell whilst on site must be reported immediately to the Show Veterinary Officer and isolated as directed.

The Society reserves the right to refuse entry or require removal of any horse showing signs of infectious disease. The cooperation of all exhibitors is essential in maintaining high standards of equine health and biosecurity at the Lincolnshire Show.

**Prohibited Substances & Medication Policy**

The Lincolnshire Agricultural Society (LAS) strictly prohibits the administration of tranquillisers, sedatives, or any substances that may affect a horse’s performance or cause unnatural behaviour in the Show Ring.

Any exhibitor, or their representative, found to have administered or allowed the administration of such substances will be dealt with at the discretion of the LAS. In addition, the matter will be referred to the relevant Breed Society or governing organisation.

Exhibitors are not permitted to bring tranquillisers or sedatives onto the Showground. The LAS reserves the right for the Honorary Show Veterinary Officer to take samples from any exhibited animal for analysis if deemed necessary.

**Malpractice**

Any exhibitor attempting to obtain a prize by false declaration or unlawful means will have all awards cancelled and may be disqualified from future Shows.

**Wristband Allocation**

Entry to the showground from the Horsebox Park is strictly limited to individuals wearing Equine Wristbands.

All riders and their accompanying associates must wear equine exhibitor wristbands for the duration of the show. These wristbands allow entry to the showground from the Horse Vehicle Park only. Please ensure wristbands are worn and visible for inspection upon arrival. Additional checks will be carried out when entering the showground and proceeding to the horse judging rings.

### **Extra Wristbands**

If additional wristbands are required for members of your equine team, owners or riders, these may be purchased at a cost of £20 each via the Showing Scene online entry system prior to the Show (maximum of five per person).

### **Vehicle Passes & Parking**

All equine vehicles will receive **ONE vehicle pass** for the duration of the Show.

No cars without trailers will be permitted in the Horse Vehicle Park. All non-towing vehicles must use the general car parking areas these are free to park in, Use GATE 5 and enter using ENTRANCE E to be close to the equine parking.

Exhibitor packs, including wristbands, vehicle passes, and other materials, will be sent out in late May / early June.

### **Prize Money**

Prize money will be issued in the form of Prize Payment Cards. These may be redeemed on the showground on the day of the Show or returned to the Showground office after the event for payment by BACS. Full instructions will be detailed on the Prize Payment Card.

## **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ALLOWED**

The Lincolnshire Agricultural Society has endeavored to ensure the correctness of the particulars printed but will not accept responsibility for any error or mistakes which may arise.

Exhibitors are required to read, understand and agree to comply with the **Regulations & Information** and the conditions applicable to all classes entered, as published in the Equine Schedule.

Acceptance of this declaration forms part of the online entry process and must be confirmed by ticking the declaration box when submitting entries via Showing Scene.

### **Show Postponement, Cancellation or Abandonment**

The Society may, in exceptional circumstances beyond its control, be required to postpone, cancel, abandon or curtail the Show. Such circumstances may include, but are not limited to, security alerts or severe weather that make it impractical or unsafe to hold the event.

In these situations, entry fees will be refunded after deduction of any administration charges.

Please note that the HOYS contribution is non-refundable.

The Society accepts no liability for any loss, damage, or expenses incurred by exhibitors or other parties as a result of postponement, cancellation, abandonment or curtailment of the Show.

### **Refunds of Entry Fees**

Entry fees will only be refundable in the event that a horse or exhibitor is unable to compete due to verified injury or illness. To be considered for a refund, a veterinary or medical certificate confirming unfitness to compete must be submitted in writing to the Show Office by Monday 1<sup>st</sup> June 2026. All issued wristbands, vehicle passes and related materials must be returned unused by Friday 5<sup>th</sup> June 2026 in order for a refund to be processed.

Withdrawals for any reason other than verified injury or illness will result in forfeiture of all entry fees.

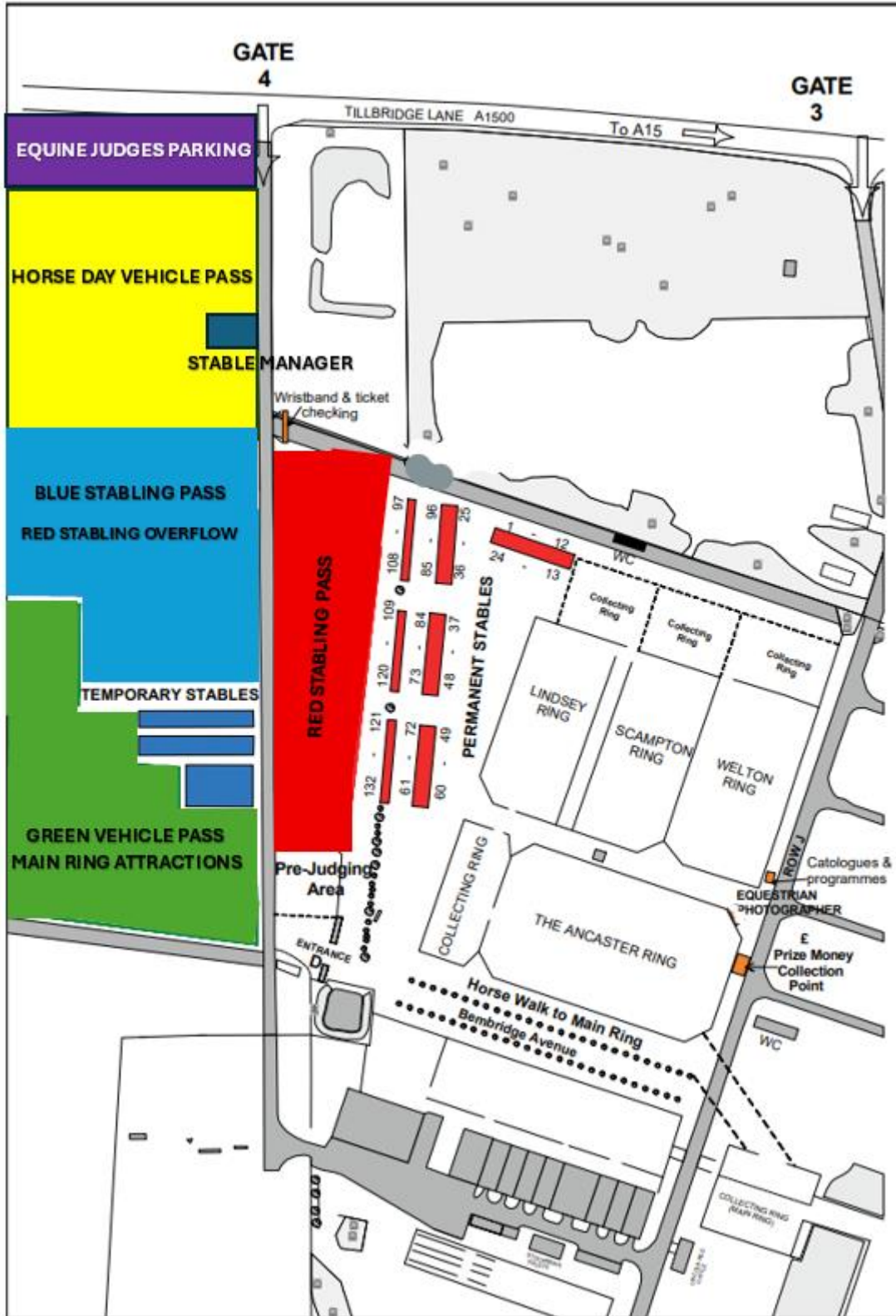
Horse Vehicle Map: Access via Gate 4 from A1500 Tillbridge Lane.

## **Riding Hat Rules**

All riders mounted on horses, ponies on the Showground or in exercise areas must wear protective riding hats that meet one of the following current approved safety standards:

- PAS 015:2011 (with BSI Kitemark or Inspec IC Mark)
- VG1 01.040 2014-12 (with BSI Kitemark or Inspec IC Mark)
- EN 1384:2023 (with BSI Kitemark/Inspec IC Mark)
- ASTM F1163 2015 or later (with SEI mark)
- SNELL E2016 or later

Hats must be correctly fitted and securely fastened with the chin strap at all times while mounted. Plain dark-coloured covers are recommended where required by class rules. Riders whose hats come off or whose straps are undone and not refastened before continuing will be disqualified.

Failure to comply with these rules may result in elimination or disqualification.

## **Measurement**

Horses in classes with height restrictions must hold a measurement certificate issued by the British Horse Society, National Pony Society, or British Showjumping. Horses without a certificate may be measured at the discretion of Judges or Stewards.

## **Conduct of Exhibitors and Attendants**

Any act of discourtesy or abuse (verbal or physical) towards judges, stewards, officials, staff, or other competitors/exhibitors may result in disqualification, forfeiture of prizes, and loss of entry fees.

- Exhibitors must follow Health & Safety and fire regulations while on the Showground.
- Horse walks must be used for all ridden, driven, or in-hand horses; guidance from officials and stewards must be followed.
- Exhibitors with nervous or highly strung horses should consider whether attending a busy Show is safe

## **Liability**

### **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ALLOWED**

The Lincolnshire Agricultural Society has endeavored to ensure the correctness of the particulars printed but will not accept responsibility for any error or mistakes which may arise.

The Society is not responsible for any injury, loss, or damage to exhibitors, staff, horses, or property while on the Showground.

- Exhibitors must maintain their own insurance, with a minimum of £5 million Public, Products & Pollution Liability.
- Maximum liability of the Society is limited to the entry fee paid.
- The Society may postpone, cancel, abandon, or curtail events for circumstances beyond its control (e.g., severe weather, security alerts). Refunds may be made minus administration fees; no other compensation is available.

### **Dogs**

Dogs must be kept on short fixed leads at all times and must not be left in vehicles.

### **Judging and Judges**

Judges must not be approached by exhibitors or spectators during judging. Stewards will enforce this rule.

Horses must appear in Catalogue order, unless stated otherwise. Showjumping classes run in drawn order.

Exhibitors must not enter an animal in a class judged by someone who has bred, owned, or gained financially from the animal. If unavoidable, a referee judge will place the affected animal.

The Society reserves the right to substitute or appoint additional judges without notice. No refunds of entry fees will be made for changes. Updates will be posted on [www.lincolnshireshow.co.uk](http://www.lincolnshireshow.co.uk).

### **Trophies**

Challenge Trophies and Cups are held for one year or until requested by the Society.

Winners are advised to insure trophies. Trophies must be returned before the 2027 Lincolnshire Show. Engraving is the winner's responsibility.

### **Protests**

Protests must be submitted in writing within one hour of the class being judged, with a £50 deposit, to the Equine Secretary Building. Frivolous protests will result in forfeiture of the deposit.

## **IN-HAND SHIRE HORSES**

Wednesday

All animals except Geldings must have been entered in the Shire Horse Society's Stud Book or Grade Registers 'A' and 'B'. All Geldings must be by a Registered Shire Stallion

### **Conditions**

1. The Society is affiliated to and classes will be judged under the Shire Horse Society Rules
2. Classes are restricted to paid up members of the Shire Horse Society. Entries will not be accepted from anyone who has been either suspended or removed from membership of the Shire Horse Society
3. Exhibitors in all competitive classes are not permitted to enter an animal in any class, which is to be judged by a person who has owned, loaned or bred the animal, or is a blood relation or spouse. The onus of complying with the regulation rests entirely on the exhibitor
4. It shall be a condition of entry that the In-Hand Shire prize winners shall attend the Grand Parade on Wednesday. An exhibitor or their staff/helpers failing to comply with this regulation shall forfeit their £20 premium

The Society acknowledges a donation towards prize money from The Lincolnshire Shire Horse Association

### **OFFER OF SILVER-PLATED SPOONS AND ROSETTES AT AFFILIATED SHOWS FOR MARES and FILLIES**

Conditions of the award are as follows:

1. A spoon and a rosette for the best mare or filly
2. The winner of the special prize must be a member of the shire horse society.
3. Entries cannot be accepted at affiliated shows in classes for shires or heavy horses from any person who has been either suspended or removed from membership of the shire horse society or has been excluded from exhibiting for prizes at shows, sales or exhibitions or from taking part in any show organised by the shire horse society

### **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ALLOWED**

4. No animal to be eligible to take more than one silver spoon during any year. The Shire Horse Society spring show being excepted

7. The council reserves the right in offering spoons, to award them only to persons approved by the shire horse society

## **IN HAND SHIRE HORSE OF THE YEAR QUALIFER**

Wednesday

The class is open purebred Shire Horse stallions, mares and geldings, 2 years old and over that are registered in, and complying with the showing requirements of the Shire Horse Society.

### **Conditions**

1. All Owners, Handlers and Exhibitors must be Members of the Shire Horse Society.
2. This class will be run in accordance with the Shire Horse Society guidelines, which for the avoidance of doubt will be considered rules for Horse of the Year Show and its qualifiers, however the general rules as set out within this Rule book will take precedence.
3. Qualification will not pass below 5th place.
4. Horses must be entered in the name and ownership in which they are registered.
5. Horses should be turned out in a traditional manner, with flights.
6. Horse's docks must be covered with a fan of hair in accordance with the Shire Horse Society rules.
7. The turning up of coats is not permitted, in accordance with the Shire Horse Society rulebook.
8. At the final and qualifiers, horses may have foot inspections carried out by a Shire Horse Society farrier and vet. Horses must be correctly shod in accordance with the shoeing standards, as detailed in The Shire Horse Society rulebook. Horses may be shown unshod.
9. Horses that are part bred or from the Grade A, B or C Registers of the Shire Horse Society are not eligible to compete. Geldings must be registered in the Shire Horse Society Non-Breeding Register and must be pure bred e.g. not out of Grade B mares, and parentage verified.
10. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office
11. This class is a qualifier for the Shire Horse of the Year Championship, to be held at the NEC, Birmingham, 7th – 11th October 2026. This class is open to pure bred fully registered Shires of two years old and over that are entered and exhibited in their appropriate breed classes at qualifying shows.

Animals must be entered correctly in line with the rules, detailed in the WPCS Judging and Showing Handbook which can be found on the Society website [www.wpcs.uk.com](http://www.wpcs.uk.com) or requested from the WPCS office. Failure to comply with the rules may result in the withholding of awards.
4. In the interest of safety all colts and stallions, two years old or over must be suitably bitted and must be led by a handler aged 14 years or older. Age as of 1st January.
5. Handlers under the age of 14 must wear a current British Safety Standard Hard Hat, gloves (optional) and suitable footwear. Age as of 1st January. Young handler rules apply to both young handler and open classes.
6. No colt/stallion or mare with foal at foot may be shown in young handler classes.
7. Parents/guardians should be advised that the animal must be of suitable height and temperament for the handler and class.
8. Children under 14 years of age must only show geldings or barren mares in open In Hand classes.
9. No child under the age of 5 may compete in open In Hand classes.

## **IN-HAND SHETLAND PONIES**

Thursday

Ponies entered must be registered in, or in the case of foals, be eligible for registration in the SPS-BS Stud Book.

### **Conditions**

1. Classes 173 to C184 and SuC136 will be Judged under National Pony Society Rules and competitors must conform to the Regulations of their respective Breed Societies.
2. Classes must be confined to SPS-BS registered ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or to foals eligible for registration.
3. Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show.
4. To enter a stallion in ANY class (in-hand or performance) at an affiliated show, entire males aged 4 years old and over must have an "S" number and have been successfully through either the SPS-BS Stallion assessment prior to 2006 or the current SPS-BS Voluntary Veterinary Examination. Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In hand colts/stallions of two years old or over must be shown bitted and are advised to display a colt or stallion bridle badge, these are available to purchase from the SPS-BS.
5. There must be no colts or stallions in Young Handlers classes. Young Handlers must be a minimum of 3 years of age on the day of the show. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or Stallions in In-hand classes. Children aged under 12 years old on the day of their class may not show a stallion in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats conforming to current British Safety standards must be worn, correctly secured, by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In-hand classes.
6. For Health & Safety purposes judges and exhibitors must remain standing whilst in the ring when showing ponies. KNEELING IS NOT PERMITTED. Hard hats conforming to current British Safety standards must be worn, correctly secured, by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes.
